The home is situated on Baraka Farm, a 200-acre dairy farm producing fresh milk for consumption and production. The farm also supports the home with fresh produce – grains, vegetables, meat, and dairy products. Proceeds from the sale of crops, livestock, and dairy products support the Lewa Children's Home.

Bulembu - Swaziland

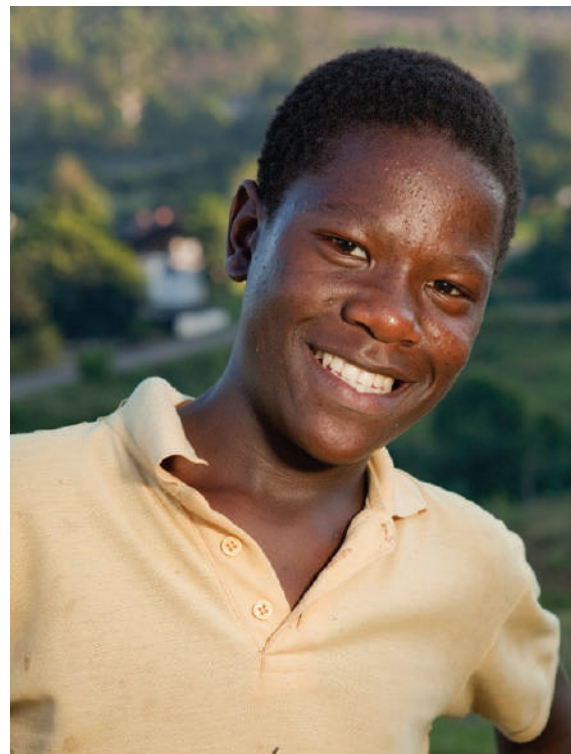
Maduduzi Fakudze is from a family of 8 siblings who lost both parents at the age of 8. They had no one to look after them and were taken to different foster homes, each raised by different family members.

They missed being together as siblings, and Maduduzi found it very difficult to be apart from them. Getting the essentials was a struggle as the family members who took them in didn't have much and would sometimes go to bed hungry.

Education became a problem because the family couldn't afford school fees. One of Maduduzi's sisters was taken to Hawane Children's Home by social welfare, where she spoke to a social worker about her siblings and wanting to be reunited with them.

In 2008, 3 months after his sister was taken to the children's home, all 8 siblings joined the Bulembu family and were reunited! The siblings thrived because of the wonderful care, love and support from all the staff members at Bulembu.

Maduduzi is now a young man and is one of many young adults that have done well through the programme and agreed to be interviewed and allowed us to share his story.



When did you arrive in Bulembu?

I arrived in Bulembu in 2008.

What did you study?

I studied Welding at Codec College and National handicrafts training center at Ezulwini.

Is it something you always wanted to do or it's a new-found passion?

I wanted to be an electrician but as soon as I finished my form 5, I interned in every department here at Bulembu and when I got to the welding part of it, that's when I knew that this is something I want to do for the rest of my life.

What is your next step?

Starting my own welding business, in Nhlanguano, my hometown. It has already started, I run it as a mobile welding business, getting to where my clients need me to be and doing work for them.

What is your dream?

It's to get to a point where my business sustains itself and it creates job opportunities for other people.

What advice do you have for people who are coming after you?

It's to follow their heart and not forget the bigger picture which is God. If you involve God in every decision you make everything becomes easier and it gets easier to identify what you're created for.

Do you still play the guitar?

A lot. It's more like a hobby. Every Sunday I make sure I'm in the worship team playing it.

What do you like doing in your spare time?

I like doing music and socialising with people.

What is your favourite food?

I don't have any, I just enjoy meat.

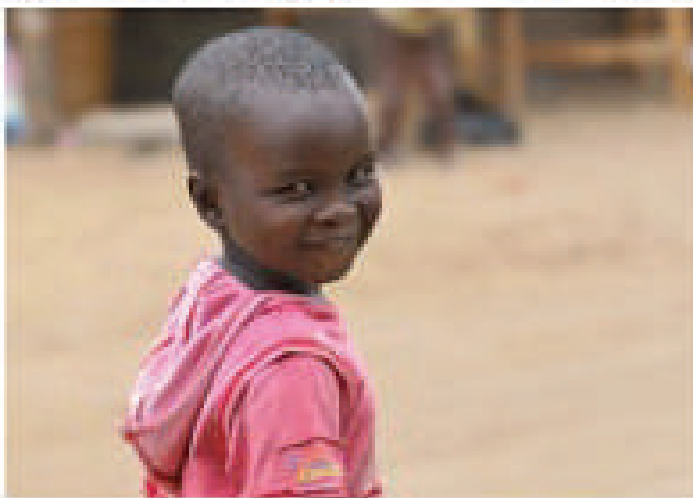
