1. Families taking hopeful steps forward in Bulembu

In Bulembu, Eswatini, around 30 parents and family members joined a week of reunification training. It was a space to learn, ask questions, talk honestly and prepare for the big step of safely welcoming children back home. With guidance from the Bulembu team and Mr Amon from World Vision, families were given practical support and plenty of encouragement. It's gentle, hopeful work, helping families feel stronger, more prepared and more supported for the road ahead.



2. Steady care and growing futures at Rhotia Valley

At Rhotia Valley Children's Home in Tanzania, daily care continues with real heart and consistency. The home is currently supporting 33 children, from little ones in primary school to older children studying at colleges across the country. Between the gardens, chickens, crops, solar power and water systems, the NGO supervision keeps creating a safe, nurturing place for children to grow. Even when things are difficult, they keep showing up with care, patience and the kind of steady support every child deserves.
